Leicestershire County Councillor Update          Cllr Poland reported that the Council's four-year budget will be considered and finalised over the next few weeks. Although the Council has achieved significant savings over recent years, pressure on local government remains. A consultation running from 13<sup>th</sup> December to 21 January. Charnwood Borough Councillor Update          Cllr Poland told the Council that the Peashill development (proposal for a large housing development off Ratcliffe Road, Sileby) went to the Planning committee in December.
